You may share my concern about the direction we are heading as a nation. Would you like to see this county, state, and nation return to conservative values?

I'm reaching out to you today to ask you to consider becoming a Precinct Delegate. Delegates are party representatives at the precinct level. There are around 5,000 of these positions in Michigan... and about half of them are vacant . . . in Muskegon County alone 251 of 322 positions are VACANT!!

I've attached a FAQ sheet to give you more information about this position and what it involves. As with anything, you can put in the minimum effort (two county conventions per year), or spend more time getting involved with the local GOP and networking with friends and neighbors in your precinct to inform about and advocate for conservative values.

Precinct Delegates as a body make quite a few key decisions, including party leadership at the state and county level, as well as Republican nominees for Lt. Governor, SOS and Attorney General. They are also best positioned to promote local candidates and community issues. Please visit MI Precinct First for more information and resources. You will be able to sign up to be a precinct delegate at our monthly meeting on April 7! We are also hoping to have a couple of other times/places where you could meet with one of the notary publics on our Board, as the completed form requires a notary signature.
